# PEWTER, METALWORK, VARIA AND SCULPTURES (LOTS 331-478)

# PEWTER (LOTS 331-361)

331 A rectangular hotwater bottle with screw top - 26 cm wide, Dutch, 19th Century; an oval box, the cover engraved with initials in a cartouche; an oval tray; and an ink-pot (4) f 80-120

332 A vase-shaped coffee-urn with reeded cover, the body with two ring handles, lyreshaped tap, on circular wood base 40 cm high, early 19th Century

333 A pear-shaped coffee-urn with loose cover, the body with scroll handle, the tap with a lyre-shaped spigot, on three scroll feet, on a brass and copper triangular and pierced trivet 49 cm high, Holland, 19th Century (2)

A Dutch circular brandy-bowl with pierced shaped handles and flower motif in the centre - 11 cm diam.; a Dutch circular plate with accolade border - 24 cm diam.; and a German circular plate engraved with a helmeted figure and text 'Lyderik de Buck.l. - 23.5 cm diam., 19th Century (3)

335 A German oval dish with double moulded accolade border with initials M.M. - 43 cm wide, 19th Century; and a Flemish baluster-shaped wine-flagon with spout, plain handle to the domed cover with name Claus - 28 cm high, 19th Century (2)

336 A Dutch baluster shaped 'engelenkan', with plain handle and thumb piece to the later cover, on circular base 28 cm high, late 18th/19th Century f 150-200

337 A cylindrical tapering wine-flagon with plain handle and thumb piece to the cover 19 cm high, 19th Century

338 A tapering cylindrical tankard of pint capacity with scroll handle - 12.5 cm high; and a holy water font, the backplate shaped as a crucifix - 13 cm high, 19th Century (2)

339 An English circular charger, with moulded rim 42 cm diam., late 18th Century f 300-400

340 A German waved tureen in Rococo style, the cover with urn finial, shaped handles, the body with text 'E.Steigertahl: Seesen: 1839', within cartouche, on shaped openwork base 35 cm wide

341 A pear-shaped feeding-bottle with screw top, on circular base 17 cm high, Dutch, 19th Century f 400-600



342 A vase-shaped pepper-pot; and a measure of half deciliter capacity, 19th Century

343 A cylindrical tapering 'Glockenkanne', the screw top with ring handle, the spirit with hinged cover, the body engraved with a flower 30 cm high, Swiss, 19th Century

345 A Dutch baluster-shaped wine-flagon with spout, double scroll handle and shell-shaped thumb piece to the cover - 24 cm high, 19th Century; and a French baluster-shaped wine-flagon with plain handle and shaped thumb piece to the cover, on circular base - 23 cm high, 19th Century

346 A cylindrical measure of half liter capacity, square handle and shaped thumb piece to the hinged cover, stamped with initials 17 cm high, French, 19th Century

348 A fine set of three chargers with moulded rim 44 cm diam., Dutch, 19th Century (3) f 800-1.200

349 An octagonal spirally-turned bottle with ring handle to the screw top 25 cm high, German, 19th Century f 300-500

350 A French baluster-shaped wine-flagon with plain thumb piece to the circular cover, plain handle, on circular base

351 A set of four tapering cylindrical apothecary measures of various capacities, each with square handle, on circular base, probably Austrian
