- 682 A pair of candle-vases with domed covers. Rim curved downwards. Hexagonal foot. Diamond-star cutting. — H. 30 cm.
- 683 A pair of crystal globular carafes with slender neck and stopper. Diamond-cutting.
- 684 A pair of crystal slender carafes with stopper. Cut sides and rim.
- 685 A pair of crystal candle-vases with covers on square base. Diamond-cutting. One defect. — with: a rectangular cut crystal small basin. (3).
- 686 A fine cut crystal tray with worked rim. The centre with a stylised floral design. — 35 x 27 cm.
- 687 A crystal cheese-dish and cover. The dish decorated with egg cutting and star motif, the cover etched with tendrils and leaves. (not matching).
- 688 A cut crystal oil and vinegar set of six flasks with stoppers, in the original black lacquered wooden stand.
- 689 A pair of cut crystal pickles-containers with stoppers. In the original black lacquered wooden stand.
- 690 A cut crystal five part toilet-set, comprising: two covered boxes, a large and a small oval tray, a small dish for rings.
- 691 LIEGE — An antique glass fruit-bowl with two handles entirely composed of segments in the shape of a Jacob's shell. On its matching saucer with ditto rim. Repair. — H. 12 cm. Diam. 20 cm. — 18th century.  
Very rare specimen.
- 692 An antique green spherical bottle with tall neck. — H. 35 cm. — 17th century.
- 693 An antique dark green glass spherical bottle with slender neck. — H. 30 cm. — 17th century.
- 694 A baluster-shaped glass vase with broad neck. The interior painted in polychrome with roses on brown ground. — H. 46 cm.
- 695 A pair of glass candlesticks with mirrored interior. — H. 26 cm. — a similar flower-vase. — H. 31 cm. (3).
- 696 A pale blue glass liver-pie jar with cover in the shape of a standing cock. Detailed plumage. — H. 23 cm. Portieux make.
- 697 A similar pale green glass pot in the shape of a sitting pigeon — a blue glass pot in the shape of a sitting hen. Vallerysthal (2).
- 698 A glass model of a standing saddled horse. The body of coloured glass. — H. 17 cm.
- 699 A coloured glass model of a swan sitting on its nest. — a similar model of a standing pig. (2).
- 700 Three small glass paper-weights, coloured glass interiors, in the shape of a hen and a rabbit. (3).
- 701 An opaline glass ashtray with blue lip. On its worked silver base (2nd alloy).
- 702 A pink opaline glass small flowervase with tall neck — another pale blue opaline small vase. (2).

## AN EXTENSIVE COLLECTION OF OLD PEWTER

- 703 A splendid pewter jar. Cylindrical body narrowing to the top and the base, on round foot. Screw off top with handle. Spout in the shape of a dragon's head and curved handle surmounted by a vase-ornament. The body finely engraved with a farmer ploughing with a horse at one side and with a cow at the other side and poem: 'Des Landmanns pflügen . . . 1809. Marked: lamb and H. D. A., dragon and G. B. — H. 49 cm. — 18th century.

- 704 A six-sided pewter wine-jar with screw-off lid and circular handle. Curved spout with hinged lid. Two sides engraved with flowers. Defect. — H. 38 cm.
- 705 A pewter conical coffepot on three curved legs with clawfeet. The tap coming out of an animal's mask and ending in a dragon's head. Fine curved handle. The domed lid surmounted by an acorn. Entirely engraved with a songbird in a fruittree and floral motifs. — H. 31 cm.  
Fine piece.
- 706 A cylindrical pewter pitcher with screw-off lid with handle. The curved spout with hinged lid somewhat deformed. Curved handle. Inscription: L.K.B., J.C.B. 1812. — H. 27 cm.
- 707 An almost cylindrical large spouted tankard. Curved handle with coat of arms. Rounded lip and beveled base. — H. 27 cm.

- 708 A pewter tankard with curved handle and hinged lid (defect). — H. 25 cm.
- 709 A cylindrical pewter coffeepot with hinged lid surmounted by a knob, pointed spout and raised forged iron handle. — H. 22 cm.
- 710 A cylindrical storage pot with lid surmounted by a vase-like knob. Inscription: Saffran. — H. 21 cm.
- 711 A pewter small samovar with two raised handles and rings. Waisted neck and wavy lip. The domed cover with wooden knob. On round base. — H. 20 cm.
- 712 A pear-shaped pewter coffeepot with domed lid surmounted by a knob. Curved spout and handle. Slight defect. Marked: crowned rose. — H. 18 cm.
- 713 A pewter figure of a standing deer with large antlers. Removable head. On its rectangular base. Under the base a dedication to H. Bese dated 1741. Marked: coat of arms. — H. 31 cm.  
Fine and rare.
- 714 A fine oval pewter tureen with domed lid surmounted by a knob. Two worked handles, four clawfeet. Lobed side and lid. Inscription at bottom C.E.B. 1746. — H. 27 cm. — Louis XV.

- 715 A fine round tureen on round base. Two almost raised handles on the side. Under the shoulder a band of stylised floral motifs in relief and applied garlands. The domed cover with beaded edge and vase-like knob. — H. 26 cm. — Louis XVI.

- 716 A round pewter soup-tureen on round foot. Domed cover surmounted by an acorn and leaves. Two ram's head handles with movable rings. On the side a relief decoration of garlands. The cover with beaded edge. Marked: angel and F.D. — H. 25 cm. — Louis XVI.

- 717 A round small tureen on round foot with two worked handles and waisted shoulder. The moulded cover with knob in the shape of a prune and leaf. The side finely carved with floral motifs in a band. Inscription: J.C.F. 1842 — H. 19 cm.
- 717 A round small tureen on round foot with two worked handles and waisted shoulder. The moulded cover with knob in the shape of a prune and leaf. The side finely carved with floral motifs in a band. Inscription: J.C.F. 1842. — H. 19 cm.
- 718 A fine pair of oval tobacco-pots on four feet. The domed covers and the body vertically ribbed. The worked feet connected by open-worked floral ornamentation. Marked: crowned X, crowned CC, flying angel, radiating sun etc. — H. 18 cm. — Louis XV.

- 719 A capital pewter saucer with everted rim and rounded lip. Smooth model with initials RIF. Slight defect. Marked: crowned rose. — Diam. 52 cm.  
Unusually large piece.

- 720 A fine pewter saucer with broad rim and rounded lip. Engraved with poem (in wenig Stunden hat Gott das Rechte gefunden) around a biblical vignette. The rim engraved with stylised plants and beaded rim. Inscription: I.F. 1794. Marked: angel, lancer, coat of arms. — Diam. 37 cm.
- 721 A pewter saucer with broad rim. Finely engraved with a representation of Adam and Eve under the apple-tree, and a deer a peacock and songbirds. Inscription at the rim: B.D.H. 1817. Marked: Justice 1724. — Diam. 36 cm.  
Very fine piece.

- 722 A pewter saucer engraved with a coat of arms. The rim engraved with floral motifs and inscription E.R. Sch. 1744. Marked: 1703 and Tower with lion. — Diam. 36 cm.

- 723 A pewter deep dish with raised side and everted rim around the side. Inscription: J. C. H. 1822. — Diam. 35 cm.  
Rare shape.
- 724 A fine pewter deep dish with everted rim and rounded lip. Lobed side, the interior finely embossed and engraved with leaves, flowers and fruit. Inscription: H.K. 1776. — Marked: Swan and C.M.T. — Diam. 34.5 cm.  
Very fine piece.
- 725 A pewter saucer with broad rim and rounded lip. Engraved design of circular bands. Inscription: P. T. Beer, 1863. Marked: C. Roessler, wall of bricks. — Diam. 35 cm.
- 726 A similar saucer, plain model. Marked: H. Augsburg. — Diam. 35 cm.
- 727 Another pewter saucer, inscription K. Marked: — Diam. 34 cm.
- 728 A pewter saucer with inscription J.C.S. 1809. Marked: coat of arms, walking horse. — Diam. 33 cm.
- 729 A similar saucer finely engraved with a rosette and circular bands. Inscription: J. Barth à Strehle 1833. Marked: Franke, wall of bricks. — Diam. 34 cm.
- 729a A saucer with finely engraved portrait of a noble lady, at the rim a floral design. Marked: — Diam. 32 cm.
- 730 A saucer engraved with two fish and circular bands. Inscription: J.E.H. 1850. Marked: A.E. — Diam. 31 cm.
- 731 A pewter plain saucer with everted rim and rounded lip. Marked: Justice. — Diam. 32 cm.
- 732 A pewter deep dish with raised side and everted lip. Engraved design of circular bands. — Diam. 31 cm.
- 733 A pewter deep dish with everted rim and two handles. Inscription at the rim: J.V.P. van F. Verhaegen, geb. 1721. — Diam. 32 cm.
- 734 A pewter deep dish with raised rim and two handles. The outside engraved with horizontal lines and R.S. 1862. Marked: angel and W.S. — Diam. 32 cm.
- 735 A similar dish. Engraved with J.S.H. 1809. — Diam. 27 cm.
- 736 A pewter saucer with rounded lip. Marked: eagle, harp, C. Bernigau. — Diam. 32 cm.

- 742 A flat plate with everted rim. — Diam. 24.5 cm.
- 743 A flat plate with bevelled lip. Inscription F.E.H. 1859. Marked. — Diam. 22.5 cm.
- 744 A pewter deep plate with raised side and two worked handles. Marked: wall of bricks. — Diam. 25 cm.
- 745 A deep plate as previous, smaller. Marked: K in laurel wreath. — Diam. 23 cm.
- 746 A pewter deep dish with raised side and two worked handles. Repairs. — Diam. 23 cm.
- 747 A dish as previous. Marked: statue and 1708. — Diam. 22 cm.
- 748 A pewter flat bowl with two worked horizontal handles. Marked: vase and 1708. — Diam. 14 cm.
- 749 A fine cup on round foot, with worked lid surmounted by a pomegrenade and leaves. Two human heads with hat as handles. Marked: crowned X. — H. 14.5 cm. — Louis XV.
- 750 A very fine pair of oval small boxes with hinged lid. On the lid a delicate relief design of an archer holding a banner and foliage, inscription: Jacob Beaulaus. The sides engraved imitating plaited reed. — 7 x 4 cm.
- 751 A pewter ice-mould in the shape of a pear, two hinged parts. Two handles and fastening. Defect. — H. 22 cm.
- 752 A pewter coffeepot with hinged lid, curved handle and pointed spout. Wavy lines on the body. — H. 27 cm. — a ditto smaller. (2).
- 753 A pewter column candlestick on round base. Inscription: J.R.K. 1809. Marked. — H. 19 cm. — a pewter funnel with ring. Marked: crowned rose. (2).
- 754 A pewter small oil-lamp on round foot with curved handle on which an acorn. Inscription J.G.F. 1864. — H. 10.5 cm. — a small hanging lamp. (2).
- 755 Two almost identical pewter pepper-castors with screw-off tops. Relief decoration of acanthus. — H. ca. 13 cm. (2).
- 756 A small pewter cup on round foot — a defect candlestick. (2).

## BRONZE-BRASS AND COPPER

- 757 A fine yellow bronze mortar with knob-like handles on the side and horizontal ribs. With its pestle. — H. 17 cm. — 17th century.

- 758 A yellow bronze mortar with circular bands on the side. Complete with pestle. — H. 11.5 cm. — 17th century.
- 759 A similar mortar with flaring mouth. Complete with pestle. — H. 10 cm. — 17th century.
