11,445 AT EDINBURGH the Twenty first day of November Nineteen hundred and forty seven the Deed herein after reproduced was presented for registration in the Books of the Lords of Council and Session for preservation and is registered in the said Books as follows:-

I, LEWIS CLAPPERTON, Chartered Accountant and Stockbroker in Glasgow, for the settlement of the succession to my means and estate after my death Do hereby ASSIGN DISPOSE and MAKE OVER to and in favour of Hugh Cowan-Douglas, Chartered Accountant in Glasgow, James Neill, Stockbroker there, and Archibald Francis Ferguson, Writer there, and such other person or persons as may hereafter be nominated by me or assumed into the Trust hereby created and to the acceptors and acceptor survivors and survivor of them (the major number accepting surviving and acting resident in Great Britain at the time being a quorum) and to the heir of the last surviving acceptor as Trustees and Trustee for the ends uses and purposes aftermentioned (the said Trust:ees with quorum as aforesaid being hereinafter referred to as "my Trustees") ALL and Sundry the whole means and estate heritable and moveable real and personal of every kind and description and wheresoever situate which may belong to me at the time of my death (including therein all means and es:tate over which I have or shall have power of disposal by Will or other:wise) together with the writs vouchers and instructions thereof And I nominate and appoint my Trustees to be my Executors and Executor and also to be Tutors and Curators Tutor and Curator to such of the beneficiaries under this Settlement and any Codicils thereto as may be in pupillarity or minority at and after my death But these presents are granted in trust al:ways for the purposes following videlicet IN THE FIRST PLACE I direct my Trustees to pay all my just and lawful debts sickbed and funeral expenses and the expenses of executing and administering the Trust hereby created IN THE SECOND PLACE I direct my Trustees to pay and fulfil such legacies annuities bequests or instructions if any as I may leave bequeath or give by any Codicil hereto or by any separate writing under my hand subsequent hereto however informal the same may be provided always such writing is initialled or signed by me IN THE THIRD PLACE I direct my Trustees to offer (1) to the Minister and Kirk Session of Carnwath Church of Scotland the pewter plate in my possession engraved "Carnwath 1764" should I still be in possession thereof at the time of my death together with the sum of Three pounds to pay for a case with a glass front to contain same on condition that it be hung or placed in the Church formerly the Parish Church of Carn:wath or in the vestry thereof and that a proper undertaking be given that it shall never be sold or parted with (2) to the Corporation of Glasgow (a) the glass picture of Mary Queen of Scots after the picture by Janet in Saint James' Palace (b) such of the prints and photographs of Glasgow hang:ing in my private room at my Office (all of which are my property) as the said Corporation may choose (c) those pieces in my collection of pewter which are marked with a "K" in red ink in the catalogue thereof or such of the pieces so marked as the said Corporation may choose (d) those pieces in my collection of old glass which are marked with a cross in red ink in the catalogue thereof or such pieces so marked as the said Corporation may choose but the articles specified under heads (c) and (d) of this clause if accepted have only to be delivered to the said Corporation on condition that they shall be kept and shown together as collections, i.e., a collec:tion of pewter and a collection of glass with power to said Corporation to lend any picture or piece or pieces for temporary exhibition in museums or exhibitions (3) to the University Court of the University of Glasgow (a) for the Hunterian Museum those pieces of my collection of pewter which are marked "H" in red ink in the said catalogue and (b) for the Library of the said University the following volumes:- "Causeries on English Pewter" by Navarro, "Old Pewter: Its Makers and Marks", "Pewter down the Ages", "Na:tional Types of Old Pewter", all by H.H. Cotterell, "Scottish Pewterers and Pewter Ware", by J. Ingleby Wood (4) to the Society of Pewter Collect:ors my Album of pewter photographs, file of pewter magazine articles et cetera and book of pewter newspaper cuttings (5) to Provands Lordship So:ciety my six Seventeenth Century Brass Candlesticks with ringed pillars and flat drip shelves (6) to my nephew Ralph Alexander Clapperton (a) the pair of Silver Cups presented by Joseph Fenton to my father's uncle John Clapperton in Eighteen hundred and twenty (b) the framed coloured photo:graph of myself in Archer's Uniform (7) to Lady Isobel Dunn Macindoe or Clapperton or Graham Kerr, widow of my brother Alan Ernest Clapperton, the round Diamond Brooch for her liferent use and on her death or in the event of her predeceasing me to Margaret Little or Clapperton, wife of the said Ralph/

Ralph Alexander Clapperton, and to Clare Jean Isobel Lewis or Clapperton, widow of the late Charles Reginald Clapperton, crescent-shaped Diamond Brooch which Brooches belonged to my mother and are in the jewel case lodged for safe custody with the Union Bank of Scotland Head Office, the key of which is in my household Account Cash Box (8) to Winifred Margaret Anne Clapperton, daughter of the said Clare Jean Isobel Lewis or Clapperton (a) the pair of Silver Tumblers dated Eighteen hundred and thirty eight engraved "D.W." which belonged to my mother's father, and (b) the Work Table with sliding top which belonged to my mother (9) to Audrey Jean Pitcairn Clapperton, daughter of the said Clare Jean Isobel Lewis or Clapperton (a) my pair of Silver gilt Thistle-topped Spoons, and (b) the framed Sampler dated Eighteen hundred and forty five worked by my mother (10) to Ruth Mary Clapperton, daughter of the said Ralph Alexander Clapperton (a) the Electro-plate Soufflé Dish and Liner with Crest formerly the property of W.R. Clapperton, and (b) the white-centred Paisley Shawl which belonged to my mother (11) to Alan Charles Clapperton, son of the said Ralph Alexander Clapperton, Silver Mother-of-Pearl Snuff Box by Jonathan Hilledge dated Edinburgh Eighteen hundred and fifty eight which belonged to my father (12) to Janet Jill Clapperton, daughter of the said Ralph Alexander Clapperton (a) the small silver Ash Tray by Gustavius Byrne dated Seventeen hundred and ninety two and (b) Modern Chinese Table Centre with Dragons IN THE FOURTH PLACE I direct my Trustees to pay the following legacies as soon as convenient after my death to each of themselves the said Hugh Cowan-Douglas, James Keill, and Archibald Francis Ferguson on their accepting office as Trustees hereunder the sum of One hundred pounds; to my god-child Grizel Mary Gibson, daughter of the late James Bogle Gibson, Chartered Accountant in Glasgow, the sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds; to Mary Dow Bissett if still in my service and not under notice the sum of Two hundred and fifty pounds and in the event of her having left my service Fifty pounds; to Jessie Munro, for many years a maid in my service, Lochhead, Acha:choish, by Lochgilphead, Fifty pounds; to The Merchants' House, Glasgow, of which I have been for many years the Auditor, the sum of Three thousand pounds to be capitalised and the revenue applied (First) for the permanent maintenance in good order and repair of the Burial Place Epsilon Thirty Five in Glasgow Necropolis at present registered in my name and (Second) for payment of pensions to deserving persons of either sex selected by the Directors and that whether or not such persons have carried on business on their own account; to the Royal Scottish Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Children for the benefit of the Glasgow Branch of said Society the sum of One thousand pounds; to the Glasgow and West of Scotland Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals the sum of Five hundred pounds; to the Glasgow Stock Exchange Members' Benevolent Fund the sum of Two hundred pounds; to the Park Church, Glasgow, provided it is still a Parish Church of the Church of Scotland at the date of my death the sum of Five hundred pounds for the Endowment Fund thereof; to the Benevolent Fund of the Institute of Accountants and Actuaries in Glasgow the sum of Two hundred pounds; to Provand's Lordship Society the sum of Five hundred pounds; to the Royal Company of Archers, King's Bodyguard for Scotland, the sum of One hundred pounds to be used at the Council's absolute discretion but with the suggestion that it might form the nucleus or part of any Fund for the compilation and publication of the Records of the Royal Company since the date of Sir James Balfour Paul's History and I declare that the receipt of the Treasurer or Honorary Treasurer for the time being of the respective Institutions and other bodies included under this Fourth Purpose shall be a sufficient exoneration to my Trustees; and I declare that the whole of the legacies bequests and sums of money hereinbefore directed to be offered delivered or paid shall be so offered delivered and paid free of all Government Duty and expenses but without interest to the date of delivery/

delivery or payment IN THE FIFTH PLACE I direct my Trustees to hold part of the residue of my estate which shall be calculated in the manner following, that is to say, such sum as shall be equal to the total residue after addition of any moneys that I may pay or may have paid to an Inter Vivos Trust in favour of the said Clare Jean Isobel Lewis or Clapperton, Winifred Margaret Anne Clapperton, and Audrey Jean Pitcairn Clapperton, and divided by half and from which half the said payment to the said Inter Vivos Trust shall be deducted (and I declare that such share shall include any interest I may have at the time of my death in Waterlands Limited and in James Reid and Company Limited to be allocated at such value as my Trustees may consider proper) and apply (Primo) one half of the income thereof to or for behoof of the said Clare Jean Isobel Lewis or Clapperton for her life for alimentary use alienably during her viduity and (Secundo) the other one half of the income or in the event of the death or remarriage of the said Clare Jean Isobel Lewis or Clapperton the whole to or for behoof of the said Winifred Margaret Anne Clapperton and Audrey Jean Pitcairn Clapperton in such manner as my Trustees may consider most expedient and on the death or remarriage of the said Clare Jean Isobel Lewis or Clapperton and or on the said Winifred Margaret Anne Clapperton and Audrey Jean Pitcairn Clapperton respectively attaining thirty years of age whichever event shall first happen for payment to them of the fee and in the event of either of the said Winifred Margaret Anne Clapperton and Audrey Jean Pitcairn Clapperton predeceasing said period of vesting and payment and leaving issue such issue shall be entitled to the share which their parent would have taken if in life and that in such proportions and subject to such provisions and restrictions as their parent may appoint by Will or other writing under her hand and failing such appointment equally per stirpes and in the event of the said Winifred Margaret Anne Clapperton and Audrey Jean Pitcairn Clapperton predeceasing said period without leaving issue who shall survive and take then the share of such predeceaser shall fall and accresce to the survivor and the issue who shall survive whom all failing by predeceasing the date of vesting I direct my Trustees to hold apply pay and make over the said share of residue to the said Ralph Alexander Clapperton and his issue subject in every respect to the same conditions provisions powers and declarations as are hereinafter contained with regard to the original share of residue destined to the said Ralph Alexander Clapperton and his issue and I provide that it shall be a sufficient discharge by my Trustees to pay the income of the said sum to the said Clare Jean Isobel Lewis or Clapperton pertaining to any beneficiary under this Trust Purpose and prior to her attaining the age of twenty one years it being the duty of the said Clare Jean Isobel Lewis or Clapperton to maintain and educate said beneficiary IN THE SIXTH PLACE I direct my Trustees to hold and apply pay and make over the sum of Fifteen thousand pounds to or for behoof of the whole children of the said Ralph Alexander Clapperton in equal shares and in the event of any of said children predeceasing the period of vesting and payment aftermentioned leaving issue who shall survive such issue shall be entitled to the share which their parent would have taken if in life and that in such proportions and subject to such provisions and restrictions as their parent may appoint by Will or other writing under his or her hand and failing such appointment then in equal shares per stirpes and in the event of any of said children predeceasing said period of vesting and payment without leaving issue who shall survive said period the shares of such predeceasing child shall fall and accresce to the children who shall survive said period and the issue of any predeceasing child equally among them per stirpes whom all failing by predeceasing the date of vesting I direct my Trustees to hold and apply pay and make over the said sum to the said Ralph Alexander Clapperton whom failing to the said Winifred Margaret Anne Clapperton and the said Audrey Jean Pitcairn Clapperton and their issue subject in every respect to the same conditions provisions powers and declarations as are hereinbefore contained with regard to the original share of residue destined to them and their issue which provisions of capital in favour of the said children and their issue shall not vest or be payable until they respectively attain thirty years of age And I provide that it shall be a sufficient discharge by my Trustees to pay the income of the said sum to the said Ralph Alexander Clapperton whom failing the said Margaret Little or Clapperton pertaining to any beneficiary hereunder and prior to his or her attaining

security of the same all as they may consider expedient but my Trustees shall not invest any of the Trust Funds in any Ordinary Stock or Shares or in any Stock or Shares on which there is any liability or uncalled capital except in the case of Stock or Shares where the uncalled capital is to be called up within one year; And I empower my Trustees to appoint Factors Law Agents and Brokers either of their own number or others and to pay them the usual professional fees or other suitable remuneration for services rendered; And I suggest that the firm of Aitken Mackenzie and Clapperton, Chartered Accountants and Stockbrokers in Glasgow, of which I am at present a partner, or their successors should be appointed Factors and Brokers, and that the firm of Baird Smith, Barclay and Muirhead, Writers, Glasgow, or any firm of which my said nephew Ralph Alexander Clapperton shall be a partner, should be appointed Law Agents in the Trust; And I empower my Trustees to compromise refer or settle by arbitration or by the advice of Counsel all questions and disputes as to my affairs or as to the meaning and intent of these presents which may arise in the course of their management and generally to manage my whole estate as fully as I might do myself; And I declare that my Trustees shall not be liable for the intrusions of any Factor or Law Agent or Broker to be appointed by them or for the sufficiency of or for any fall in the value of the securities in which they may invest the Trust Funds provided the said Factor Law Agent Broker securities and investments were reputed sufficient or considered eligible by my Trustees at the time, the evidence of which shall be the Minutes of the Trust; And I declare that an Account of the intrusions of my Trustees under their hands and duly audited by a reputable firm of Accountants shall at all times be held as conclusive evidence of the state of the Funds under their management, and they shall be entitled on making up and certifying such account to obtain from all concerned a ratification and approval of the same and of all their former actings and intrusions: Declaring further that parties paying moneys to my Trustees whether on the realisation of any means and estate or otherwise in any manner of way shall not be entitled to enquire into or see to the application of the same; And I reserve my own liferent of the premises and full power to alter or revoke these presents at pleasure in whole or in part; And I specially revoke and recall all testamentary deeds and writings heretofore executed by me; And I dispense with delivery: And I consent to registration hereof and of any Codicils or other writings relative hereto for preservation: IN WITNESS WHEREOF these presents consisting of this and the four preceding pages are (under the declaration that the words "of fifteen" occurring in the fourteenth line, and the word "and" occurring in the twenty second line, counting both from the top of Page Fourth hereof, are partly typewritten on erasure before subscription) subscribed by me at Glasgow on the Second day of April Nineteen hundred and forty two before these witnesses Maurice Sidney Paterson, Cashier, and Janet Leggat Gordon, Clerk, both to Messrs. (FIRST) I hereby appoint my nephew Ralph Alexander Clapperton a Trustee under the said Trust Disposition and Settlement: (SECOND) (one) in addition to the bequests to the Glasgow Corporation I bequeath to them for exhibition in the Kelvingrove Art Gallery or the People's Palace (a) set of nine copper Vintner's Measures, two gallons, one gallon, half gallon, quart, pint, half pint, gill, half gill, quarter gill; (b) Blue and white Aset with picture of Glasgow Cathedral; (c) Flower pot shaped Bell (late Sixteenth Century) said to have been "The Dede Bell of Maybole" see Catalogue of Glasgow Exhibition Nineteen hundred and eleven; (d) Rosary and Cross dated Eighteen hundred and twenty two said to have belonged to Lady Louisa Stewart of Traquair born Seventeen hundred and seventy six and died Eighteen hundred and seventy five, daughter of Charles, Seventh Earl of Traquair; (e) The largest of the six Seventeenth Century Brass Candlesticks with ringed pillars and flat drip shelves and one of the three smallest; (two) In respect that Doctor T. J. Honeyman, Director of the Glasgow Art Galleries has expressed a wish to have some Scottish Hill Walking Sticks to add to the collection of Scottish articles in the Museum, I direct my Trustees to allow him or his successor in office to select as many as he wishes from my collection; together with any of my books on Old Table glass or on antique furniture which he may desire for use in the said museum: (three) I hereby cancel the bequests to Provand's Lordship of my six Seventeenth Century brass Candlesticks with ringed pillars and flat drip shelves and in place and in lieu thereof I bequeath to the Society two of the three small candlesticks and two of the larger ones and in addition the similar candlestick without drip shelf: These items are all very rare, particularly the candlestick without the drip shelf: (four) in addition to the bequests to the University Court of the University of Glasgow for the library of the said University I bequeath any of my books on old pewter which they may desire: (five) in addition to the bequests to my nephew Ralph Alexander Clapperton I now bequeath (a) the small silver salver by John Keems, Edinburgh, dated Seventeen hundred and forty eight which was presented to me by the Members of the Glasgow Stock Exchange in Nineteen hundred and forty three; (b) coloured photograph of the picture of Volunteer Review in Glasgow in Eighteen hundred and sixty one with the key showing my mother in the foreground, and (c) Case of four medals; (six) I cancel the bequest of a diamond brooch to Lady Graham Kerr and bequeath it to Margaret Little or Clapperton, wife of the said Ralph Alexander Clapperton: (seven) I bequeath in addition to other bequests to Audrey Jean Fitzcain Clapperton the small silver salver (date stamp 1891) left me by my cousin, Edith Mallam; (eight) I bequeath in addition to other bequests to Ruth Mary Clapperton my small "Luckenbooth" paste heart-shaped brooch exhibited at the Glasgow Exhibition 1911; (nine) I bequeath to the Kirk Session of the Park Parish Church the water colour drawing of his wife by Robert Anning Bell, R.A. which was his first sketch for the panel of Mary Magdalene in the reredos of the Church; (ten) And further I direct my Trustees to make the catalogue of my collection of pewter available to any beneficiary interested therein: (THIRD) (a) I increase to Two hundred pounds the legacy of One hundred pounds to each of my Trustees Hugh Cowan Douglas, James Neill and Archibald Francis Ferguson; (b) I increase to Five hundred pounds the Legacy of Two hundred and fifty pounds bequeathed in the Fourth Purposes of the said Trust Disposition and Settlement to Mary Dow Bissett; (c) I increase to One hundred pounds the legacy of Fifty pounds to Jessie Munro, Lochhead, Ashaholish; (d) I increase to One thousand pounds the legacy of Five hundred pounds bequeathed in the Fourth Purpose of the said Trust Disposition and Settlement to the Park Church, Glasgow, on the conditions and for the purposes expressed therein: (FOURTH) I direct my Trustees to pay legacies of Two hundred pounds free of Legacy Duty to each of the following being descendants of my cousin Edith Rotherham or Mallam namely:- (one) Mrs/

Newsome, Warwick Castle, Park House, Warwick: (four) Mrs. Monica Esther Madwen, Byfield, Brockham Green, Betchworth, Surrey: (five) Peter Mallam, Newmans Guest House, Bute, Bristol: (six) Stephen Mallam, Park Gate, Vicarage Road, Hampton Wick, Kingston-on-Thames: (FIFTH) I direct my Trustees (one) to pay to the University Court of the University of Glasgow the sum of Three thousand pounds to be devoted to such purposes as the said Court may determine: (two) to divide in such proportions as they may in their uncontrolled discretion determine the sum of Three thousand pounds among the Glasgow Royal Infirmary, The Western Infirmary of Glasgow and The Victoria Infirmary of Glasgow and such charitable institutions and societies as I have been in the habit of subscribing to either directly or through the City of Glasgow Society of Social Service and I declare that the receipt of the treasurer or honorary treasurer for the time being shall be a sufficient discharge (three) to divide the sum of Five hundred pounds between those members of the staff of Aitken, Mackenzie and Clapperton who are employed by the firm at the date of my death and have been so employed during the preceeding ten years (service in the forces excepted) in proportion with their respective salaries and I declare that the whole of the legacies bequests and sums of money hereinbefore directed to be offered delivered or paid shall be so offered delivered and paid free of all Government duty and expenses but without interest to the date of delivery or payment and with these alterations I confirm my said Trust Disposition and Settlement: IN WITNESS WHEREOF these presents are subscribed by me at Glasgow on the nineteenth day of December Nineteen hundred and forty five before the witnesses Catharine Douglas Brown and Mary Anderson both Clerks to David Smith, Barclay and Muirhead, Solicitors, Two hundred and five Saint Vincent Street, Glasgow.
