## Period Table

The prevailing fashion in design of any period, time or area that reflects current taste, is called the style. Period refers to that portion of time determined by some happening, act, cycle or series of events. The time a ruler occupies the throne is known as period of rule.

The compiler or creator of new furniture ideas frequently lent his name to the new styles introduced. This illustrated in the creations of Chippendale, Sheraton, Adams Brothers, Hepplewhite, Shearer, Manwaring and others. These styles were the prevailing fashion during the reign of two of the House of Brunswick kings, King George II, and King George III, or the period 1727-1820. This period is sometimes called the Georgian Period, a loose characterization of the moving spirit in styles throughout this time. The rule of King George I is marked as a time of transition in styles. Gradual change from the Queen Anne Period occured during this time from 1714 to 1727. The King George I Period is sometimes included in the Georgian Period classification. It marks the changing of styles prior to the ascendancy of Chippendale.

The period of King George IV (1820-1830) is rightfully excluded. It represents an era when most furniture styles were heavy in design and shows clearly the influence of the overpowering "Empire Period." It carried little of the refinements of

the above mentioned earlier makers. This shows the relation of style and period.

The following chronological table of French and British rulers will be of assistance in correlating periods in their relation to furniture styles.
