

- 48 An urn-shaped vase with twin scroll handles on stepped domed base —8in. (20cm.) high
- 49 A GERMAN WINE CAN, the spirally gadrooned body inscribed K. I. F. 1712 with engraved screw top— $8\frac{1}{2}in$. (22cm.) high
- 50 A German circular plate engraved with a displayed eagle and the date 1822—9in. (23cm.) diam., touches; and another engraved with shields and the initials E.M.G. 1810—9in. (23cm.) diam., both early 19th Century (2)
