- 30 A pair of candlesticks, the turned and baluster stems on domed circular bases— $11\frac{1}{4}in$. (28.5cm.) high
- 31 A SET OF FOUR CUP SALTS, the circular bodies on turned short stems and domed spreading circular bases—3\frac{3}{4}in. (9.5cm.) diam., mid-18th Century (4)
