A PAIR OF SHELL-SHAPED SALTS, 3in. (8cm.) diam.; a shell-shaped double salt, 4½in. (10.5cm.) wide; an oval wavy-edged patten, 4¾in. (11.5cm.) wide; and a collection of five assorted plates, mainly 18th Century, average 9in. (23cm.) diam. (9)

A SOUTH GERMAN FLAGON with scroll handle and shaped thumbpiece to the domed cover and spout, the flared cylindrical body engraved with an armorial crest, 19th Century 10½in. (27cm.) high

A SOUTH GERMAN FLAGON with scroll handle and shaped thumbpiece to the domed cover and spout, the flared cylindrical body engraved with a flower, 19th Century 11in. (28cm.) high

127

A SWISS STEGKANNE with baluster body and scroll handle and double voluté thumbpiece to the domed cover and turned finial, the faceted spout joined by an arm, on circular foot, late 18th Century 12½in. (32cm.) high

A SCOTTISH 'POT-BELLIED' MEASURE, the baluster body with D-shaped handle and shaped thumbpiece to the domed cover, late 17th Century (damaged) 9½in. (24cm.) high

AN ENGLISH BALUSTER PINT MEASURE of 'bud' type with flat circular cover and scroll handle to the thumbpiece, early 18th Century 6in. (15cm.) high

A MATCHED SET OF IRISH HANDLELESS BALUSTER MEASURES ranging in capacity from half-pint to quarter-gill, 19th Century

A SET OF CONCENTRIC WEIGHTS of Renaissance style with scroll handle and hinged circular cover to the fluted tapering body enclosing the graduated weights all bearing punched stamps

A COLLECTION OF TWELVE BULBOUS MEASURES of varying capacities ranging from pint to quarter-gill, 19th Century (12)

A FRENCH PORRINGER, the circular bowl cast with a rosette applied with pierced and scrolled handles, touch B.I.W. (not recorded in Tardy)

A FLAGON of gallon capacity with cylindrical body inscribed Anchor, Acton, and scroll handle to the shaped spout, 19th Century

A TRIFID SPOON with mask finial and pear-shaped bowl, 6½in. (17cm.) high; a plain spoon with pear-shaped bowl, touch AB; 6¼in. (17cm.) high; and another with a seal top, touch iron, 17th/18th Century, 7in. (18cm.) high (3)

AN OAK BIBLE BOX with notch moulded rectangular hinged lid and foliate carved front applied with lock-plate and key, 17th Century

AN ELM AND BEECHWOOD WINDSOR ARMCHAIR with arched railed back, solid seat and turned legs, 19th Century

ANOTHER of elm and beechwood, 19th Century

A PAIR OF OAK DINING-CHAIRS of 17th century style with pierced foliate crestings and caned backs and seats on baluster legs and stretchers (2)

A WALNUT OPEN ARMCHAIR with tall arched and caned back with foliate cresting, the padded seat on canted scrolled legs with arched front stretcher, late 17th Century
