PEWTER

- 1 Thirteen plain circular dinner-plates, eleven stamped H. Carew— $9\frac{1}{2}$ in. (242 mm.) diam., London, circa 1800, struck London superfine hard metal, with lion rampant with key and coronet, (Cotterell 6039) and X crowned (13)

- 2 Six plain circular soup-plates— $9\frac{1}{2}$ in. (242 mm.) diam., London, circa 1800, struck with X crowned and superfine hardmetal (6)

- 3 Seven plain circular dinner-plates, each with moulded rim—*touchmarks indistinct*; another—probably by *Richard Cuming*; another—by *Edmund Mills*, struck with X crowned; another—by *W. Cockey*; and another—by *John Dolbeare*, average diam., 9½in. (242 mm.) 18th century (11)
- 4 Sixteen plain circular dinner-plates—mostly London with X crowned, some by *Humphrey Evans*, of Exeter, average diam. 9½in. (242 mm.), 18th century (16)
- 5 Two plain circular soup-plates, each with moulded rim—9¼in. (235 mm.) diam., by *Lawrence Langworthy*, Exeter, touch dated 1719, (*Cotterell* 2839); a further two with plain rims—9½in. (242 mm.) diam., and two plain circular second-course-dishes—11in. (280 mm.) diam., London (6)
- 6 A set of three George II plain circular chargers, each with moulded rim—17in. (432 mm.) diam., to 19in. (482 mm.) diam., by *John Dolbeare* (3)
- 7 Four plain circular chargers, each with moulded rim—18in. (457 mm.) diam., touches indistinct; and a plain circular hot-water dish—18½in. (470 mm.) diam. (5)

DIFFERENT PROPERTIES

- 8 Two Normandy measures with acorn thumbpieces— $7\frac{1}{2}$ in. (191 mm.) high and 7in. (179 mm.) high, probably Dutch (2)
- 9 A vase-shaped coffee-pot and hot-milk jug— $9\frac{1}{2}$ in. (242 mm.) high and $7\frac{1}{2}$ in. (191 mm.) high; another pair stamped with a band of vines—9in. (230 mm.) high and $7\frac{1}{2}$ in. (191 mm.) high; another pair ditto stamped with a band of scrolling foliage— $9\frac{3}{4}$ in. (248 mm.) high and $7\frac{1}{4}$ in. (185 mm.) high; and two travelling candlesticks on shaped moulded bases— $6\frac{1}{2}$ in. (165 mm.) high and 6in. (153 mm.) high, each German, 19th century (8)
- 10 Two flacons with scroll and shell thumbpieces—10in. (255 mm.) high and $10\frac{1}{2}$ in. (262 mm.) high; another smaller with orb thumbpiece— $6\frac{3}{4}$ in. (171 mm.) high; a polygonal coffee-pot and hot-milk jug— $8\frac{1}{4}$ in. (210 mm.) high and 6in. (153 mm.) high; a small bowl; a salt-cellar; and two various plates (9)
- 11 Twelve plain circular dinner-plates, some engraved with initials and stamped Superfine Hard Metal with X crowned— $9\frac{1}{2}$ in. (242 mm.) average diam. (12)
- 12 A plain circular alms-dish, the rim engraved Dissenting Congregation Edin^b. 1804—15in. (381 mm.) diam., by Robert Kinniburgh, Edinburgh

- 13 A plain circular second-course dish engraved with a crest—
12 $\frac{1}{8}$ in. (308 mm.) diam., by Richard Going, Bristol, struck
with X crowned
- 14 AN EARLY DUTCH MEASURE, with bulbous base and incurved
neck, flat hinged cover with hammerhand thumbpiece
engraved with an owner's housemark—8 $\frac{7}{8}$ in. (225 mm.)
high, sixteenth century, the base with relief-cast medallion
of a lion rampant in shield, within circular frame

ARMOUR

- 15 A plain breast-plate of siege weight with shot proving mark
—English, circa 1630
- 16 A bright steel Spanish morion, the one-piece skull with pro-
nounced peak and with narrow brim roped at the border
and pointed to the front and rear, with line of rivets and
brass washers—Italian, late 16th century
- 17 A bright steel breast-plate of peascod form with turned
heavily roped upper border and arms, the upper part
embossed with scrolls—Italian, late 16th century
- 18 A composite suit of Japanese armour, comprising helmet,
shoulder-guards, mask and neck-guard, do, haidate and
other pieces; a fire-watching hat; a Japanese hantachi; and
a Malayan dha (a lot)
