A PAIR OF GEORGE III BRASS CANDLESTICKS with knopped octagonal and circular shafts on square gadrooned plinth bases
10½in. (26cm.) high (2)

2

A DINANDERIE CIRCULAR BRASS ALMS DISH with gadrooned embossed centre surrounded by a gothic inscription, the border engraved with flowers and crosses, 18in. (46cm.) diam.; and another, the centre embossed with flowers, banded by a double gothic inscription, the border engraved with decorative motifs, 17½in. (44.5cm.) wide (2)

A DINANDERIE CHARGER, the centre repoussé with gadroons with inscription border and punched decoration, early 17th Century
16¾in. (43cm.) diam.

A BRASS AND COPPER BED WARMING-PAN with geometrically pierced cover and iron handle, 17th Century, 37½in. (96cm.) high; and another, similar, 42in. (107cm.) high (2)

5

TWO DUTCH BELLMETAL CANDLESTICKS with wide circular drip-pans and multi-baluster shafts on domed plinth bases, 17th Century
19½in. (50cm.) high (2)

A PAIR OF LARGE BRASS ECCLESIASTICAL CANDLESTICKS with castellated drip-pans on turned and knopped shaft, chased with leaves and pierced domed bases decorated with studs and Latin inscriptions on ball feet, 19th Century

A LITRE MEASURE of baluster form on moulded foot, engraved with two rings around the body, with scroll handle, the flat cover with double acorn finial, late 18th Century
8½in. (21.2cm.) high

A TAPERING CYLINDRICAL TANKARD, with a rib around the body and scroll handle, the domed cover with corkscrew thumbpiece, circa 1740, maker's mark LI
8in. (20.3cm.) high

9

A SWISS OCTAGONAL PRISMENKANNE, with moulded shoulder, raised cover and ring handle, the straight cylindrical spout with detachable screw cover, engraved with names and initials, circa 1800, the cover struck with unidentified touch marks

A FLAGON of tapering cylindrical form on moulded base, with a rib around the body, curved spout and scroll handle, engraved with an inscription, circa 1740 (the cover removed)
11¼in. (28.5cm.) high

A SWISS PRISMENFLASCHE of hexagonal section, with a moulded band around the base, the raised cover with foliage and scroll ring handle, engraved with initials and dated 1813 within pricked foliage, circa 1800
10½in. (26.7cm.) high

A CONTINENTAL CYLINDRICAL GLOCKENKANNE, with turned wood handle at right angles to the octagonal spout, the domed cover with baluster finial, engraved with initials GW and dated 1803, unmarked, circa 1800, probably Swiss
7¾in. (19.5cm.) high

13

A PAIR OF CONTINENTAL PRICKET-CANDLESTICKS, each on three claw-and-ball feet, with waisted triangular section above chased with strapwork and foliage, with multi-baluster stem and circular wax-pan, 19th Century, converted for electricity
23¾in. (60.5cm.) high

14

A PLAIN CIRCULAR CHARGER, with moulded border, engraved with initials EG, by John Batchelor, Bristol, circa 1700
16½in. (42cm.) diam.

AN ALE-JUG of baluster form, with curved spout and scroll handle, the moulded domed cover with openwork baluster thumbpiece, engraved with initials, circa 1800
7⅝in. (19.4cm.) high

A SCOTTISH PLAIN TAPERING CYLINDRICAL COMMUNION FLAGON, with scroll handle, the flat cover with bifurcated lobe thumbpiece, circa 1800
10in. (25.4cm.) high

A FINE SCOTTISH CIRCULAR ROSEWATER DISH, the deep well of terraced form, with copper and enamel boss to the centre bearing the arms of James VI and I, by Richard Weir, Edinburgh, circa 1605
