

### A WILLIAM AND MARY PEWTER CHARGER

Circular with side rim and molded edge, with pseudo hallmarks (indistinct)
22in. (55.5cm.) diameter

Estimate: \$300-500

### A PAIR OF CHARLES II PEWTER CHARGERS CIRCA 1670

Each with broad flat rim, with pseudo hallmarks and with monogram 'VIT' on rim, the underside with touch mark 'ITI' and '1666' beneath a crown

14in. (35.5cm.) diameter
Although the maker's mark is recorded it is unidentified.

### A GEORGE I PEWTER SERVING PLATTER

Of oval dished form with broad flat rim engraved with a lion crest; together with another similar of slightly later date, with various marks and pseudo hallmarks 20in. (51cm.) and 16in. (41cm.) long (2)

### AN ASSEMBLED SET OF SEVEN PEWTER CANDLESTICKS

Probably Sellew & Co. (1832–1860) or Homan & Co. (1847–1854), Cincinnati, Ohio, 1830–1860

Each with flared nozzle and baluster stem, on circular foot 10in. (25.5cm.) high

For a similar example, see Charles F. Montgomery, A History of American Pewter (New York, 1973), p. 96. (7)

## TWO PAIRS OF PEWTER CANDLESTICKS PROBABLY SELLEW & Co. (1832–1860) OR HOMAN & Co. (1847–1854), CINCINNATI, OHIO, 1830–1860

Each with flared nozzle and baluster stem, on domed foot, two with engraved floiate decoration to rim at mid-section and foot, put-up bottom impressed 'e' or with four dots 8½in. (21.5cm.) high, the tallest (4)

Estimate: \$500-800

### A MATCHED SET OF FIVE ENGLISH PEWTER ONE-HALF PINT MEASURES

19TH CENTURY, ONE BY YATES & BIRCH, ANOTHER BY JAMES YATES, BIRMINGHAM

Each of slight tapering form with molded midsection and scroll handle, with various proof marks; together with five Georgian small dishes, marked LONDON and another similar-3½in. (8.5cm.) high and a Georgian covered sugar bowl with urn finial and bright-cut engraving (12)

Yates and Birch were working in Birmingham in circa 1800 and were succeeded by James Yates, working until 1840.

### A GROUP OF TEN PEWTER TUMBLERS

### AMERICAN, 19TH CENTURY

Each with tapered form with incised ring decoration, one with maker's mark of Ashbil Griswold (1784-1853), Meriden, CT, and another with maker's mark of Timothy Boardman (w. 1822-1825), New York City, 7in. (16.8cm.) high, the tallest

Estimate: \$600-900

#### A GEORGE III PEWTER TEAPOT

### 18TH CENTURY

The domed lid with wooden and stepped finial, the baluster body with scroll handle and spout, touch mark with a crown, crosses and B... (partly obliterated)- 6in. (15cm.) high, together with a George III tobacco box, circa 1800, cylindrical with domed lid and lead tamper, marked 'J'- 5in. (13cm.) high, and two modern Dutch trencher salts (4)

### A SCOTTISH TAPPIT HEN PEWTER FLAGON CIRCA 1790

With domed lid engraved 'WL', tapered body and cylindrical lower section engraved 'IH', with scroll thumbpiece- 16½in. (42cm.) high, together with a late 18th century jug, with squared side handles and pear-form body on cylindrical base, with incised rings, touch marks- 11in. (28cm.) high, and an Italian jug, with wide flattened sput and ringed body, various touch marks- 11in. (28cm.) high(3)

### TWO GEORGE III PEWTER INK STANDISHES LATE 18TH CENTURY

One with trefoil base supporting sander, quill and lidded ink wells, with thumbpiece and small drawer on incurved feet6in. (15cm.) long, the other of cube form pierced for quills, with hinged bell-form lid and drawers for quills and sander3in. (7.5cm.) high (2)

An Irish cube-form ink standish with maker's mark is illustrated in H.H. Cotterell, *Old Pewter Its Maker's and Marks*, 1929, p. 112, fig. F

### SIX PEWTER PORRINGERS

AMERICAN, 18TH AND 19TH CENTURIES

Each circular with pierced handles, two with "flowered" handles, of which one is markes by Samuel Hamlin (1746-1801), Connecticut and Rhode Island, four with "Old English" handles, various sizes- 8 to 3¾in. (20 to 9.5cm.) long (6)

### A MATCHED SET OF EIGHT CONTINENTAL PEWTER MEASURES

19TH CENTURY

Comprising: a double litre, litre, demi litre, double decilitre, decilitre, demi decilitre, double centrilitre, and centrilitre, each of cylindrical form with squared handle and raised lid, with various marks

Comprising half-gallon, quart, pint, half-pint and gill, each of tapering form with rounded handle, all with maker's touch mark except gill measure, marked with a crowned 'X', some with proof marks

9¾ to 3¾in. (25 to 9.5cm.) high

Munster Iron Co., 94 North Main Street, Cork was producing in circa 1858-1905.



### A GEORGE III PEWTER QUART SPOUTED TANKARD

**CIRCA** 1770


With domed lid, slight pear form engraved with monogram and short molded foot, with scroll handle and spreading thumbpiece-  $7\frac{1}{2}$ in. (19cm.) high; together with two Victorian pewter ale jugs, mid-19th Century, one with stepped lid, baluster body and scroll handle, the other with domed lid, ring-incised baluster body, and scroll handle with shell-cast thumbpiece, stamped 'cs MILLAR' twice- 11 and 7in. (28 and 18cm.) high

Estimate: \$700-900

### A SET OF FOUR CONTINENTAL PEWTER PLATES Circa 1780

Each with waved reeded edge, three with maker's mark stamped 'BLOCK ZIN KLINGLING', the fourth with 'SO' above a crowned figure and impressed '37'- 9½in. (24cm.); together with five dishes with wide rims, the two smallest with pseudo hallmarks, marked 'LONDON' with crowned X

Estimate: \$200-300

### A GROUP OF FIVE PEWTER PLATES

### American, late 18th or Early 19th Century

Each with molded rim, two marked by Thomas Badger, Boston, one each by Samuel Danforth, Hartford, Connecticut, John Skinner, Boston, and Jacob B. Whitmore, Connecticut - 9½in. (23.5cm.) diam. largest; together with three American bowls 8in. (20.5cm.) diameter, the largest (8)

### 18TH/19TH CENTURY

Each with shallow dished bowl and narrow rim with molded edge, two each by Nathaniel Austin, Charlestown, Massachusetts, Joseph Danforth, Middleton, Connecticut and David Melvile, Newport, Rhode Island, one each by Thomas Badger, Boston, B. Barnes, Philadelphia, Gershom Jones, Providence, Samuel Kilbourne, Baltimore, and George Lightner, Baltimore, minor variations in sizes 8¾in. (22.5cm.) diameter (11)

### A QUEEN ANNE PEWTER TANKARD

#### CIR CA 1700

Of slight tapering form with domed lid, scroll thumbpiece and handle engraved with monogram 'MBB' and later 'CM', with molded foot, with pseudo hallmarks and further mark of a crown and an X-6¾in. (17cm.) high; together with a George III pewter tankard, early 19th Century, by Townsend & Compton, London, of slight tapering form with domed lid, pierced scroll thumbpiece and scrolled handle ending in a C-scroll, with maker's marks-7½in. (19cm.) high

Townsend & Compton are recorded working at Prescott Street, Goodman's Fields and later Booth Street, Spitalfields from 1801-

Estimate: \$600-800
