- A pair of mid-18th Century English brass Candlesticks, the sconces on mushroom knopped, and faceted baluster stems, the shaped base of square form with cusped corners, stamped beneath, George Grove, 19cm. high (2) £500-600
- An 18th Century French brass lidded Shaving
  Mug of baluster form, the handle with volute
  thumbpiece on splayed foot, 19cm. high
  £150-200
- 214 An early George II brass Snuffer Stand, the baluster stem on hexagonal base, complete with brass snuffers, 11cm. £200-300

- 215 A pair of 17th Century Continental brass Candlesticks with knopped stems and flanged sockets raised in (later?) acanthus-chased cast hexagonal bases, with integral drip-pans, 24cm.

- 216 A very large tinned copper oval Serving Dish with plain rim, 101cm. long, 18th/19th Century £200-300

- 226 An 18th Century Swiss Glockenkann with ring carrying handle and cast shield at side inscribed GST 1761, Zurich maker's mark of HZM on spout cover at front, 27cm. 200-300
- An 18th Century French Pichet of shouldered form, the heart-shaped lid with twin-acorn thumbpiece, handle inscribed *lac. Morel*, base stamped with C quality mark, 26cm. £130-160
- 228 A one-pint baluster Measure, by Randall Moring, the lid with double-volute thumbpiece, 15.2cm., circa 1800 £100-125
- 229 An 18th Century Dutch pierced basket-shaped 'Kettle' Stand, 19cm. diam.; a small lidded German Stitze, 15cm., circa 1800; and a oval German dish engraved with a hunting scene, rococo rim, 26cm. long (3) £100-120
- 230 A good French broad-rimmed Dish with narrow-shaped edge, stamped with ownership NC at top, maker's touch of CvH? dated 1685 and C quality mark of? Rouen on reverse, 38cm., late 17th Century £300-400

A Charles II Charger with very shallow boss in centre and reeded edge to the rim, engraved in a wreath at top with date 1669 and initials RB over IT, maker's 'hallmarks' of a buckle struck four times below and indistinct bust touchmark on reverse, 55.3cm. diam., 'Collezione Faraone' label on back £400-500

An interesting short Flagon of 'Beefeater'-type inscribed at front: one of the three Flagons given by Mis Hannah Gwynn to ye Company of Spoonmakers in Glocec. An Dm 1688', between two armorials, the Master and Warden's names below, 24.5in. to lip (the lid a replacement)
